APPLICATION FEE

All candidates are required to deposit Rs.2000/- using the procedure appearing in the on-line application form. The on-line application form fee is non-refundable, non-transferable and non-adjustable. Any plea in this matter will not be entertained.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

All residents of India fulfilling the eligibility criteria mentioned below can apply for RUHS PMC 2025 for admission through lateral entry directly to second year of B.Sc. (Medical Lab Technology)/Bachelor of Radiation Technology/ Bachelor of Ophthalmic Techniques course in various government, constituent and private self-financed colleges affiliated to Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur, on the basis of instructions given in this information booklet, the relevant rules of RUHS, Jaipur and direction of state government.

EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION

All candidates passed in Diploma in Medical Lab Technology/ Diploma in Radiation Technology/ Diploma in Ophthalmology.

DOMICILE CRITERIA

Lateral entry Admission directly to Second year of a Undergraduate paramedical course through RUHS **Admission/Counseling Board 2025** is open to all residents of India. However, preference shall be given to candidates of Rajasthan domicile.

REGISTRATION

Registration with Rajasthan Paramedical Council is mandatory.

RESERVATION

The reservation of seats will be made subject to statutory provisions enacted by State of Rajasthan. Candidates belonging to reservation categories of states other than Rajasthan shall be allotted seats in the un-reserved category.

Candidates seeking benefit of reservation shall be required to produce the caste certificate (SC, ST, ST-STA, Non creamy layer OBC, Non creamy layer MBC, EWS) or the additional category certificate (PwD, if applicable) issued by the competent authority and submit attested copies of the above documents for verification, at the time of joining at the allotted college.

OBC/MBC candidate must submit original OBC/MBC Certificate for Rajasthan State issued by competent authority of Rajasthan (issued within one year of the last date of submission of application form) and clearly indicating 'Non Creamy Layer') at the time of joining.

EWS candidate must submit original EWS Certificate for Rajasthan State issued by competent authority of Rajasthan (**valid for financial year 2025-26**) at the time of joining.

PwD reservation: 5% seats shall be reserved on Merit-cum-Priority in each category horizontally in accordance with the applicable provisions. On the notified date, the PwD candidate must produce PwD certificate (issued by Competent Authority) during physical disability verification before the Medical Board constituted by RUHS, Jaipur for the purpose. (*Appendix H-1*)

The tentative number of seats in each course is given at the website. The number of seats may change; in such a case, the exact number of seats shall be notified on RUHS website.

FEE STRUCTURE

- Based on the directions of the State Govt. / State Level Fee Fixation Committee (letter no. **F7(3)ParaMed/DME/2015/2948 dated 30/07/ 2015**), the fee structure for Paramedical courses for the session 2024-25 is as below:

- For academic session 2025-26, the candidates are required to pay the fee as prescribed by State Government from time to time, for the course.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Before filling the application form, read the information booklet etc. very carefully. Ensure the eligibility and other requirements for admission as given in this booklet.

You should be very careful in filling-up the application form. If any lapse is detected during the scrutiny, your candidature will be rejected even if you come through the final stage of admission process or even at a later stage.

Fill the application form and Option form (Choices) and upload the following documents (scanned pdf file) as applicable:

1. Transaction proof of payment of Rs.2000/-
2. Date of Birth Certificate:10th class marksheet / certificate
3. Marksheet of 10+2 (Senior School Certificate Examination) or its equivalent
4. Copy of photo ID (Driving Licence / PAN card / Voter ID / Govt. or PSU card / School ID card /12th class examination admit card / Aadhar card)

5. Marksheet of Diploma course Part I and Part II examination
6. Degree / Provisional Certificate of the Diploma Course passed
7. Domicile Certificate of Rajasthan state, if applicable
8. Caste Certificate, if applicable
9. Any other relevant certificate(s)

Prepare two sets of the same and keep one set safely with you for submitting at the time of joining at the allotted college.

The decision of the **RUHS Admission/Counseling Board 2025** in all aspects and all respects pertaining to the application and its acceptance or rejection as the case may be, conduct of RUHS PMC 2025 and at all consequent stages culminating in the admission or otherwise of any candidate shall be final in all respects and binding on all concerned.

The **RUHS Admission/Counseling Board 2025** reserves its right to alter and modify time and conditions laid down in the notification, information booklet for conducting the various stages upto the admission, duly intimating details there of on the RUHS website, as warranted by any unforeseen circumstances arising during the course of this process, or as deemed necessary by the **RUHS Admission/Counseling Board 2025** at any stage.

ADMISISON PROCEDURE

The admissions shall be made strictly in accordance with merit list prepared on the basis of total marks obtained in the respective Diploma course and the order of choices / options filled in by the candidates in the option / choice form. The candidates are advised to exercise their choices / options very carefully.

Important to note: If at any stage, it is found that a non-eligible candidate is admitted to a course, then the admission of such a candidate will be cancelled on such detection. A penal action may also be initiated against such candidate.

ALLOTMENT OF COLLEGE AND COURSE

The allotment of college and course shall be made by strictly following the order of merit prepared on the basis of total marks obtained in the respective Diploma course, seats available in each college and the priority of choice/option of the college.

Candidates securing equal marks will be admitted in the following order of preference:

1. One who has obtained higher aggregate marks in 10+2 examination
2. The candidate of higher age (older candidate).

After allotment of college, candidates will be informed about their allotment at RUHS website. Candidate is required to take a printout of the page showing his/her allotment and join at the allotted college with this printout alongwith requisite documents, in original, and prescribed fee, by the notified date.

Then on-viewing of the RUHS website about allotment information by the candidate

shall not be accepted as a ground for non-joining at the allotted college on the scheduled time and date. The candidate's allotment will stand automatically cancelled if he/she does not report IN PERSON to the allotted college as per notified schedule.

No further allotments will be done by **RUHS Admission/Counseling Board 2025** after this allotment.

JOINING AT ALLOTTED COLLEGE AND DEPOSITING OF FEES & OTHER DOCUMENTS

At the time of joining at the allotted college, the candidate will have to carry printout of allotment letter and one set of application form. The candidate is required to deposit prescribed fee along with original and one set of attested photocopies of requisite documents.

The colleges shall be provided the list of candidates allotted. The colleges shall verify the credentials of reporting candidates as per this list and check the documents and other required certificates with originals.

Note: In-service candidate must submit relieving letter from his/her appointing authority at the time of joining for admission at the allotted college. In case of non-submitting the relieving order from the appointing authority by the last date of joining at the college, the admission will automatically be cancelled.

ADMISSIONS ON THE VACANT SEATS, DROP-OUT SEATS

No admission shall be made after a date as notified by RUHS / Admission Board (**i.e. 15-01-2026**).

The decision of the RUHS / Admission Board shall be final and binding to all.

The admissions shall be treated as provisional subject to the final decision of any pending case(s) in any court of law, if applicable to these admissions. Further, the provisional status of admission shall stand cleared only after enrolment by the RUHS.

All the judgments relevant to these admissions, passed by any Hon'ble court of justice as well as rules existing at the time of making admissions will be applicable on these admissions and the candidates will have to abide compulsorily with such judgments, rules and the changes.

The jurisdiction for legal cases arising out of RUHS Pharmacy Lateral Entry Admission 2025 shall be limited to the High Court of Rajasthan, Jodhpur/ Jaipur Bench. The apex court drew guidelines for the management of all educational institutions, among them:

Educational institutions should take anti-ragging measures right from the time of advertisement for admissions.

The information brochure, the form for admission and/or any other literature issued to aspirants for admission must clearly mention that ragging is banned in the institution and

anyone indulging in it is likely to be punished appropriately which may include expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.

The punishment may also take the shape of:

Withholding scholarships or other benefits

Debarring from representation in events

Withholding results

Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess.

If there be any legislation governing ragging or any provisions in statute/ordinance, it should be brought to the notice of the students/parents seeking admissions. A printed leaflet detailing when and to whom a victim may turn for information, help and guidance for various purposes, keeping in view the needs of new entrants, along with their addresses and telephone numbers should be given to fresher at the time of admissions that they need not to look to seniors for help in such matters.

Appendix “H - 1”

Guidelines regarding admission of students with “Specified Disabilities” under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with respect to admission in _____

- Note : 1. The “Certificate of Disability” shall be issued in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (*Divyangjan*)] on 15th June 2017.
2. The extent of “specified disability” in a person shall be assessed in accordance with the “Guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016)” notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (*Divyangjan*)] on 4th January 2018.
3. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability.
4. **The term ‘Persons with Disabilities’ (PwD) is to be used instead of the term ‘Physically Handicapped’ (PH).**
